About South Merrimack Christian Academy

History

South Merrimack Christian Academy (SMCA) was founded in 1996 by the leadership of Merrimack Valley Baptist Church (MVBC) in Merrimack, New Hampshire. A small preschool had been in operation at the facilities prior to MVBC's acquisition of the property. When the church took ownership of the facilities in the 1980s, the church leadership simply allowed the preschool to continue meeting in their building. Over time, the church leaders grew concerned that the preschool was not operating in the spirit and philosophy of Christian education. Thus, in 1996, they decided to transform the preschool into what is now SMCA. They added a grade a year until 2001, when they hired Mr. Brian Burbach as



the administrator and added 6th through 12th grades all at once. The school has seen steady growth in the ensuing years-progressively adding more students and faculty to the point where the school reached a peak enrollment of around 300 students.

As the school has developed from its infancy to its current position as a well-established educational institution in southern New Hampshire, its primary hallmark is the atmosphere of grace and balance that fosters a spirit of community and fellowship in those who are a part of it as students, parents, alumni, staff, faculty, or administrators. The school places a healthy emphasis on the doctrines of the Bible and on the standards of conduct for Christians that are clearly laid out therein. It does this, in a spirit of graciousness, transparency, and the firm belief that we are all "works in progress" as human beings and that God is a loving being who offers forgiveness, mercy, and second chances to us despite our shortcomings. Although SMCA is a strong school with solid academics, well-rounded programs, and qualified faculty, it is this atmosphere of grace that stands as the school's most endearing and magnetic characteristic.

Foundations

Mission

South Merrimack Christian Academy, a ministry of Merrimack Valley Baptist Church, is a life preparatory school in partnership with parents to cultivate the academic, spiritual, and emotional growth of students and to inspire them to influence our culture for Jesus.

Philosophy and Purpose of Christian Education

Our resolve is to approach education from a biblical point of view. This is accomplished through intentional Bible instruction each day, as well as relevant chapel services held each week. In addition, the whole program is taught in an

atmosphere acknowledging the existence and love of God. In the observance of holidays, for example, we emphasize the religious rather than the secular significance. Although Christian Education is the basic and important part of our program, it does not detract from the rest of the curriculum. It is our purpose to provide our students with a curriculum that is of the highest



quality. The curriculum that best fits our criteria is a combination of the A Beka program and Bob Jones University curriculum. We encourage students to achieve a high standard of performance in each of their classes.

Statement of Faith

- ❖ We believe the Bible to be the inspired Word of God, complete and without error in the original manuscripts.
- We believe in one God, existing in three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, co-equal in every way.

- ❖ We believe that Jesus Christ was born of a virgin and was divine and sinless. Jesus died vicariously, atoning for our sins; rose bodily; ascended to heaven; and is imminently and personally coming again.
